
#### COVID Update: Students Fairing Well & On-site Testing Coming Soon to TIMES<sup>2</sup>

According to the recent data report from the Rhode Island Department of Health, approximately 102,125 (57%) of Providence residents were tested for COVID-19 with 18,822 (18%) testing positive. As you know, TIMES<sup>2</sup> partnered with RIDOH to assist in the contract tracing mechanism used to inform students, staff, and faculty of potential COVID-19 exposures. As part of this data collection, our school nurse keeps track of the probable cases, outside of school close contact exposures, and total number of positive cases. Probable cases are individuals who, upon arrival to school, are noted to have

1 or more symptoms related to COVID-19, and are, therefore, sent home for medical follow-ups. Our to date school data shows that nearly 81% of students do not fit into any of these 3 categories.

After a successful pilot in Central Falls, RIDOH and the RI Education Operations Center is offering school-based testing to Rhode Island schools. TIMES<sup>2</sup> Academy will take part in this excellent opportunity to not only increase staff, student, and community safety measures, but to also increase our communities' confidence in bringing back students to our school's classrooms.

More information on the testing schedule, permissions process, and how they will occur will be sent out to families



once the plan has been put into place. Until then, please stay safe, wear a mask, and wash your hands!

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## Attention, Attention: What you need to know before you return to school after vacation:

If you traveled outside of Rhode Island or the contiguous United States during the vacation, you are required to uphold the 14-day quarantine before returning to school. This is the most conservative approach to prevent in-school transmission based upon the facts below:

- 1. COVID-19 can develop any time between 2-14 days after exposure.
- 2. A single negative test only indicates that you are negative at that point in time, but you could become infectious any time through day 14.
- 3. Quarantining for 14 days before returning to school is the best way to reduce the change of exposing the school community to COVID-19.
- . Per RI testing data, approximately 26% of individuals who attended school either in-person or hybrid came to school asymptomatic and later tested positive. This number is important for everyone to understand STAY HOME if you or anyone in your family has had close contact or has tested positive with COVID. Our school nurse will send anyone home with a single symptom out an abundance of caution.

TIMES<sup>2</sup> Academy, in partnership with the Rhode Island Department of Education and its fellow

members of the League of Charters, has automated the admissions process to make it easier for families to apply to a Charter School of Choice. This collaborative Unified Enrollment process is streamlined to make the application process easier, faster, and much simpler. Families can access the Family Information Tool (FIT) on the EnrollRI.org/charter website and review all of Rhode Island's charter schools in one place with just the click of a mouse. FIT

#### **CAUTION:**

Contact Tracing Identity Theft Advisory

The Rhode Island Education Operations Center has received reports of an alleged RI Department of Health (RIDOH) contact tracer who requested the Social Security number of a COVID-19 positive student which was then used to fraudulently open a credit card account. Besides your date of birth, RIDOH will NEVER require you to provide any other personal identifying information that could cause fraud or deception. Please stay vigilant to ensure your personal information remains safe.

Take the following steps if you believe you have encountered a contact tracing scammer:

- If contacted by a RIDOH contact tracer who requests MORE than your date of birth, you should attempt to verify their credentials, including their call-back number and that of their supervisor.
- If you are unable to verify the contact tracer's credentials, IMMEDIATELY hang up the phone and submit a complaint through the Federal Trade Commission at ftc.gov/complaint or reportfraud.ftc.gov.
- 3. Never disclose your Social Security Number, credit card numbers, or other financial information over the phone with an alleged contact tracer.
- 4. DO NOT click or download links you receive via text or email from an alleged contact tracer. It may contain malware.

**REMEMBER - DO NOT** give your social security number, bank account or credit card number, or immigration status! RIDOH will NOT ask for this information. So if a person claiming to be from RIDOH or RIDE asks for this information, please know it is a SCAM!

First, students will be presenting their projects to their immediate classmates. Students will explain their projects to their peers and their science teacher. After their presentation, the class will be able to ask questions. The teacher will assess the project and assign a grade. If students are interested in competing at the RI Science and Engineering Fair and they receive a high score, they will advance to the next level of competition.

Students competing for a spot on the team heading to RISEF will have another level of exhibition. These students will present to a panel of teachers and administrators. This panel will select the top 10 to represent TIMES<sup>2</sup> Academy. RISEF will also be virtual.
